Farmer's Market

A farmer's market will be held in the Forest Library parking lot this summer every Saturday morning from 8:00 am to 1:00 pm beginning on April 30th and continuing through October 29th. Fresh farm produce including vegetables, fruits, meat, cheese, eggs, regular and gluten-free bread, and other specialty items will be offered for sale. You won't want to miss this opportunity to



buy delicious, truly fresh, right-off-the-farm produce, directly from the farmer, right here in Forest. In addition to the Forest Library, the market is supported by Bedford County and the Virginia Tech Extension Service.

By-Laws Amendment Passes

The Ivy Hill Homeowner's Association By-Laws were amended in February to increase the number of members on the Board of Directors from the original five to "not less than seven (7) or more than fifteen (15)." This was a much-needed change in the opinion of previous IHHA officers, given both the growth of the Ivy Hill community and the growth of the association. Thank you to everyone who participated in the voting, including the more than 50 members who took advantage of electronic voting via e-mail for the first time. The final vote was 142 in favor of the amendment and 1 opposed.

Seven Member Board Elected

In keeping with the amended By-Laws, a new seven-person Board of Directors was elected at the February 24th annual meeting. Ivy Hill Website

It has been suggested that a website be developed for the Ivy Hill Community. A website committee consisting of Bill Hite, Roger Lohn, and Lew Walton visited a number of homeowner association websites in January to see what features they offered and put together a questionnaire to gauge the interest of the community. Recently, that questionnaire was transmitted electronically

to a sample of over 100 homeowners whose e-mail addresses are in the Ivy Hill database. If you have an interest in this subject and would like to participate in the study but you did not receive a questionnaire by e-mail, contact any of the committee members. They will be glad to get you a copy of the questionnaire. A recommendation will be made to the IHHA Board later this year once all of the responses have been evaluated.

Christmas Luminaries

At their January meeting the IHHA Board discussed whether we should continue the Ivy Hill Christmas Luminary event for another year. Turnout this past year was significantly reduced requiring the volunteers to work about twice as long as they did in previous years to fill all the luminaries and set them out. In addition, it was noted that many luminaries were never lit and some bags were still laying out several days after the event. This event cannot continue without stronger community support. Therefore the Board is seeking early commitments to volunteer for the 2011 event. Contact any member of the IHHA Board before the end of April if you will be willing to help. If the response is insufficient, the 2011 event will be cancelled.

Repairs at Main Entrance

Work is underway to repair the damage at the main Ivy Hill entrance caused by the March 3rd accident. New Ivy Hill signs will be carved, the 6x6 wooden post supports and surrounding brickwork will be replaced, and the landscaping will be replanted. The lights that illuminate the sign at night also need to be repaired. The repairs are expected to take about two months.

In just a few days it will be officially spring again. It is hard to believe how fast time goes by, but I'm still glad to see winter gone and everything turning green again. If you have driven by the course in the last two weeks or so, I'm sure you have noticed how green it is turning.

With Daylight Saving Time here, all the evening leagues are kicking off. The senior men play Tuesday evening, all the men Thursday evening. Couples' Captain's Choice outings are Friday evenings, with dinner following. And there are many other weekly organized activities scheduled for those of you interested in playing.

With the warmer temperatures and longer daylight in the evenings, it is time to remind everybody of a very important safety concern. A golf ball is very hard and travels very fast. And while I don't know of any serious injuries here at Ivy Hill, every year people are seriously injured and even killed from being hit by golf balls. Our golfers are not looking for people walking on the course, and we have had some near misses, especially in the evenings. I have also had calls from our golfers who had to wait for walkers to get out of the way before they could play a hole.

We want you to come out and play the course. (If you don't play golf yet but would like to learn, we are offering free clinics, for men on Monday evenings and women on Thursday evenings, beginning in April.) We want you to enjoy the views of the course. But we do ask that you respect the golfers, and protect your own safety, by not being on the golf course, especially when golfers are there. Thanks for your cooperation here.

While the temperatures continue to warm, many of you may start thinking about cooling off in the summer. Of course we have the pool at Ivy Hill, which will open on Memorial Day weekend, closing on Labor Day. All golfing memberships include use of the pool, but pool-only memberships are also available. They are \$200 for an individual and \$350 for a family. Forest Volunteer Fire Department

The Forest Volunteer Fire Department (FVFD) which was founded more than 50 years ago, is an all-volunteer organization. There are currently 42 members. Like the FVFD, the present fire station is over 50 years old. While the FVFD has 10 vehicles, the present fire station has only 6 vehicle bays, all too small to hold the ladder truck and other large equipment which the FVFD needs to service the larger buildings that have been recently constructed in the county, including the new JFHS science wing. It is also located on a road that cannot support a 72,000-lb vehicle which is the weight of a ladder truck.

You can become a permanent part of this new facility by purchasing an Engraved Brick for a one-time donation of \$400 (or \$100 per year for five years). The engraved bricks will pave the walkway into the new station. Your brick will be seen by all the visitors and will be a lasting feature of this very special facility.
