Ivy Hill History

It has been almost twenty years since a very heavy June rain - almost ten inches fell in less than a day - caused Ivy Creek to overflow its banks, flood the low-lying part of the golf course around the 12th green, and wash out Quail Ridge Drive at the low point between Quail Meadows Drive and Millstone Terrace. The photo was taken after VDOT had started repairs. Gilfield Village did not exist then, so for a number of days the folks that lived in the new neighborhoods in the north end of Ivy Hill were



cut off from the rest of the community. The only way out overland, if you were fortunate enough to have a four-wheel-drive vehicle, was to cut across the farms behind Ivy Hill to Cottontown Road.

Most of the residents in the cut-off neighborhoods were also without power, water, and land-line phone service for several days. Those utilities ran underground adjacent to the roadway and were also severed by the washout. Note the temporary poles that APCO erected to provide emergency power to the northern end of the Ivy Hill subdivision.

Neighbors helped neighbors when and where they could. One enterprising resident - Fran Roberson on Millstone Terrace - even ferried her neighbors across the flooded 12th fairway behind her house in her canoe. (The 12th green was briefly an "island" green.)
