#### **FVFD Open House**

The Forest Volunteer Fire Department held an open house on Saturday, May 5th at the new Forest Fire House on Thomas Jefferson Road (Route 811). The truck bays in the south wing of the new fire house are finished and in use; the Fire Department relocated all their vehicles from the old "downtown" fire station at the beginning of the year. (The new owner plans to site a micro-brewery in the former fire house.) However, the main two-story administrative heart of the new fire house is currently an empty shell. We were shown markings on the main floor where the walls will be and where various functions will be performed. The upper floor plans tentatively include provisions for sleeping quarters for night-shift personnel should that become necessary in the future as the community grows.

An estimated \$200,000 is required to finish the new Forest Fire House, which the FVFD must raise through donations from the community. If you would like to help support this critical community service, contact Bob Bashore at 525-0889.







#### **Forest Farmers Market**

Attendance at the Forest Farmer's Market has seemed to grow almost every week in the two months since it opened for the season. More and more vendors are participating offering a wider selection of foods and crafts; some from as far away as the western side of Bedford county and even a few from the surrounding counties. The word is spreading and as a result more and more area residents are turning out each Saturday morning to stroll along the pavilions buying home baked breads and pastries; fresh vegetables and fruits; meats and eggs raised on local farms; jams, jellies & honey; bedding plants; and unique quality crafts.

The Market will be held every Saturday through October 27th in the parking lot behind the Forest branch of the Bedford Public Library. In addition, two holiday Markets will be held this year; a Thanksgiving Market on Saturday, November 17th and a Christmas Market on Saturday, December 22nd. # **Allen Harvey**

We note with sadness the passing of Allen Harvey who died on Wednesday, June 20th after a long battle with cancer. Mr. Harvey founded Ivy Hill and was instrumental in the early development of both Ivy Hill subdivision and Ivy Hill Golf Course; built Ivy Lake; started Ivy Hill Realty; and with the help of his extended family and various business partners created many of the special neighborhoods in the Ivy Hill community.

His funeral at Fort Hill Memorial Park was attended by hundreds of relatives, friends, neighbors, and local dignitaries. It featured a military salute performed by the VFW and a flyover by five of his Silent Aviator buddies; fitting tribute to this World War II era bomber pilot who loved to fly and kept a plane at Ivy Hill airfield for many years.



# **Ivy Hill History**

This old gazebo formerly stood on the north shore of the pond on the sixteenth hole to the right of the serpentine bridge. It's full history is unknown. It predated the construction of the golf course and the flooding of the pond by many years. It once overlooked a swimming pool that was subsequently filled in and is now at the bottom of the present water hazard.

# June 19<sup>th</sup> Windstorm

On the evening of June 29th a derecho "straight line" windstorm hit Ivy Hill about an hour after dark with strong winds that were variously reported to be 55 to 75 miles per hour. The windstorm was part of a powerful line of thunderstorms that did extensive damage and knocked out power over a broad area that included West Virginia and Tennessee in addition to Virginia. Damage in the Ivy Hill neighborhoods included downed trees, torn roofing, broken gutters, smashed windows, and overturned outdoor furniture on existing home sites and framing blown down on one house that





was under construction. Three of the remaining seven Bradford Pear trees on the 'island" at the main Ivy Hill entrance were totally destroyed and one was badly damaged.

The power was out in Ivy Hill from late Friday evening until early the following Tuesday evening . Residents pitched in to clear downed trees and debris off the streets. Neighbors with generators helped neighbors without power when they could by recharging cell phones, refrigerating medicines, and making ice.
