# **Ivy Hill History**

The upper photo was taken back in the 1970's when Ivy Hill was just getting started. Only a few roads had been roughed in when this photo was shot. Three homes are under construction along the south side of what is now Trading Block Lane. These were some of the first homes built in the new development. Note the total absence of any vegetation on the building sites. The ridge in the foreground is completely bare. The 17th hole of the golf course and the hills beyond are plainly visible in the distance.

The lower photo shows substantially the same view as it looks today. The house in the foreground looks much the same. (Maybe the shutters have been replaced or refinished?) However, the most obvious differences are the landscaping; the well-kept lawn, the beautiful flowering bush in the foreground, and the many tall trees. The neighbor's house can barely be glimpsed through the twin trees in the front yard and the mature plantings behind the houses form a complete screen through which the golf course can no longer be seen at all from this angle. What a difference 40 years make!

# Ivy Lake Entrance Sign

The new sign is finally in place at the Ivy Lake entrance! Thank you to everyone involved in this long project:

- Thank you to IHHA President Ed Schwabe for pulling together the community response, getting the necessary quotes, and arranging for the work to be done.
- Thank you to Signworx for creating the sign and installing it.
- Thank you to the *Ivy Lake Homeowners Association* and the *Golfdominium Property Owner's Association, Inc. (Shaker Lane I)* for contributing \$200 each to the project.

When the original sign was destroyed by vandals at the end of last year, the IHHA pledged \$200 towards its replacement and suggested that each of the impacted neighborhoods/associations (Ivy Lake, Shaker Lane I and II, Haines Point, Cedarberry, Mallard Cove, and Overlake) contribute what they could afford. The fundraising process stretched out much longer than anticipated. Several months passed. Finally, in the early summer and with only about half the necessary amount raised, the IHHA Board voted to go ahead and replace the sign anyway. We remain hopeful that some of the other neighborhoods/ associations will still be able to contribute.

# **New to Ivy Hill?**

Are you new to Ivy Hill? If so, here's some information that your realtor may not have passed along:

- There's a leash law in effect in all of the Ivy Hill communities at all times. Dogs should always be walked on leash or restrained by an invisible fence. (Physical boundary fences are not allowed in Ivy Hill.) Also, if you walk your dog off your property, please pick up after them.
- Commercial vehicles, RVs, trailers, and boats should be parked in your garage or stored off site, not in your driveway. Vehicles are not to be parked on the streets of Ivy Hill.
- Please put out your garbage and recycling on the morning of pickup or late the previous
  evening and return them to their storage areas as soon as possible after pickup. Garbage cans
  and recycling containers should be stored in your garage or an enclosed utility yard where they
  are not visible from the street or the golf course.
- If you are planning an addition or a major change to the exterior of your house, be sure to get your plans approved by the Architectural Committee first. Contact Rene Koch at renekir@msn.com or 525-2935.
