Runk & Pratt will take possession of the lake after the spillway is repaired and approved by the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation. Liberty expects to complete the spillway repair by winter of next year. Runk & Pratt wants to make Ivy Lake a community lake again, as it was before Liberty took over ownership. Liberty will not have any part of the lake after the sale. I hope the whole community will embrace this as a positive outcome. I believe that Runk & Pratt will be a great neighbor for the Ivy Hill community. They have already purchased the golf course and are renovating the club house. See the article on Page 4 of this newsletter about the club house renovation. They will also be purchasing the Harvey estate, where the Runks plan to live. As reported in a previous newsletter, they are also considering constructing a senior living community on a vacant property adjacent to the golf course.


This winter was strange. One snow in December and warm days in February. Some of the flowers started to come out and trees started also to bloom. I hope the flowers and trees will survive.

Lakepointe Sign Lighting Upgrade

This winter the IHHA upgraded the lighting at the beautiful Lakepointe entrance. Several of the fixtures that illuminate the striking entrance sign and surrounding landscaping had deteriorated over the years. They have now all been replaced.

Additionally, the expensive halogen bulbs in all of the fixtures have now been upgraded to the new LED technology. This will provide greater illumination while generating less heat in the fixtures. This upgrade should add considerable longevity to the system while reducing monthly operating expenses.


- Check your 2013 Directory if you have one. Is the information that we have for you correct? If not, please let us know.

CLUBHOUSE 2.0

New owners Brian and Vickie Runk unveiled the first stage of the planned major renovations being undertaken at the Ivy Hill Clubhouse at a well-attended celebratory golf tournament held over the weekend of March 18th-19th. If you haven't had the chance to check it out yet, you should. The changes are spectacular.

The outdoor landscaping and front terrace have both had a serious makeover while the new interior layout has an open and modern feel featuring all new floor coverings, an exposedbeam ceiling, and lots of lighting. The pro shop has been expanded and modernized. It will soon carry Titleist golf equipment in addition to Callaway. The snack bar on the raised center section has been completely redone with a unique barrel-supported food bar, all new tables, and soon an expanded menu. Meanwhile, the end of the Clubhouse nearest the parking lot, has been turned into a high-end lounge/sports bar. The bar occupies the space where the buffet tables used to be, large flatscreen TVs have been mounted on the wall. and the rest of the space has been refurnished with very comfortable sectionals and armchairs. Be sure to check out the bar top, carved from a single huge tree trunk.

Brian Runk said that the next stage of the renovation will tackle the restroom area. The men's and women's restrooms will be refurbished and the restaurant area will be extended into the space between to provide additional seating. Further in the future, the Runks plan to convert the unfinished second floor of the building into additional event space.

Vickie Runk, who was the interior designer on the project, emphasized their vision that the Clubhouse be a gathering place for the whole Ivy Hill community; a place where you can drop in for lunch with friends, have a meeting, watch the Master's or other sporting event together, or just hang out. "It's not just about golf anymore", she said.



Ivy Hill History - A Life Well Lived

In September of 2003, Jack and Jettie Harris moved into their home on Quail Ridge Drive. Very soon thereafter, Jack became a familiar figure on the golf course and the cart path, both as a golfer and as an avid jogger. At age 81, he had already lived a full and colorful life as a B-24 bomber pilot, the owner and manager of JHarris Aviation, a flight school in Delaware, and as a successful industrial engineer with factory-building experience in the Mid-East.

Jack was a quiet man with bright blue eyes and a puckish smile. He never had a great



Literally the entire community knew of Jack and looked forward to seeing him on his daily venture. On December 14, 2016, Jack fell and broke his hip. The fracture was not serious, but the inactivity incurred by that fracture put him in Summit Rehabilitation Center, where he died of heart invoked pneumonia forty days later.
