Entrance Maintenance

A series of IHHA work parties on June 21st, 22nd, 23rd, and 24th pruned the suckers off all of the trees on the "island" at the Ivy Hill main entrance and started repair work on the main Ivy Hill entrance sign. The front post holding up the two sign boards has deteriorated and needs to be replaced. We carefully removed the sign boards and dug up the front post only to find that it was embedded in what appeared to be a solid block of concrete filling almost the entire front quarter of the brick planter.

Fortunately, just before making the decision to rent a jackhammer, we did some exploratory chipping with a hammer and chisel and found that the apparently solid block was actually a pile of bricks and cinder blocks cemented together by a relatively small volume of poor quality concrete. Several days later we were still chipping away, but most of the post and about ¾ of the pile had been demolished. We still had a short stump embedded in the remains of the pile as this newsletter went to print. Stay tuned.





The Future of Ivy Lake

While this is a matter that affects all members of the Ivy Hill Community, it is most pertinent to those who live around Ivy Lake and have lakefront property. As you already know, Runk & Pratt is set to acquire Ivy Lake in the near future. Currently, Liberty University still owns the lake, and will not transfer ownership to Runk & Pratt until after they have made the necessary repairs to the lake's dam and spillways. Once Liberty University makes the spillway repairs, the lake can be brought back up to full pond. Until that time, if any members of the community have any questions or concerns about the repair process, or about any sort of disruptive or unsupervised activity at the lake, we ask that you direct those inquiries toward Liberty University, and not Runk & Pratt. While Runk & Pratt hopes to acquire the lake as soon as possible, keep in mind that there is no timeframe or deadline for these repairs. Until Liberty finishes them and transfers ownership, Runk & Pratt has no legal jurisdiction over the lake and what happens on the surrounding properties. We sympathize with lakefront homeowners and all members of the Ivy Hill community as you hope for a speedy transition of ownership. We look forward to being a greater part of your community in the near future.
