#### **IHHA President's Message**

So your Board has decided to replace the roof with high quality architectural shingles. This will be a significant additional expense for the Association.

#### **Spring Cleanup**

We have noticed a lot of debris and overgrown plantings in neighborhood yards and especially in undeveloped lots and along the roadways in recent weeks. Now that the weather has improved and we can all get back outside, it is time to clean up lvy Hill. So please pick up the debris in your yard and along the roadway in front of your house, trim your bushes and plantings if they need it, repair any damage from the recent wind storms, and generally fix up your property. Also, if you can, please cleanup any vacant properties adjacent to your property.

As we noted in past Newsletters, the Forest Volunteer Fire Company sometimes finds fire hydrants difficult to get to because they have become surrounded by tall weeds or overgrown bushes. Any time lost accessing a fire hydrant can be crucial in a structural fire. They urge you to "adopt" the fire hydrant that is nearest to your home. Clear the weeds and cut back any bushes during the growing season. Dig it out of the snow in the winter. Keep it accessible year round.

Also, winter has taken its toll and we see fading siding, missing shingles, and peeling paint on a number of houses. Now is the time for a general spring fixup. Our property values all go up when our neighborhood looks good and people want to move here.

Let's make Ivy Hill beautiful!

#### **Ivy Hill History**



The recent decision to reroof the gazebo at the main Ivy Hill entrance started us imagining all of the changes that old gazebo has seen in its lifetime. The photo above shows the gazebo decorated for Christmas this past December 2018. Note how it is dwarfed by the four crepe myrtles that surround it.

The top picture in the column to the right shows almost the same view in April 2007. One of the crepe myrtles is visible just to the left of the gazebo. It still looked more like a bush than a tree and hadn't reached the roof line yet. Note also the huge flowering trees down the middle of the "island" where the light poles now stand.

The middle picture shows the same view in 1974 when the Ivy Hill main entrance was first constructed and the gazebo was brand new. There was almost nothing around it then! The "island" was empty except for the gazebo and the little Ivy Hill Golf Club sign.


The gazebo may have been modeled on the much older gazebo shown in the bottom picture. It formerly stood on the north shore of the pond on the sixteenth hole to the right of the serpentine bridge. It's full history is unknown. It predated the construction of the golf course and the flooding of the pond by many years. It once overlooked a swimming pool that was subsequently filled in and is now at the bottom of the present water hazard.

#### **Crepe Myrtles**

It has been many years since the crepe myrtles that stand at the four corners of the gazebo at the Ivy Hill main entrance trees were last pruned and they had become somewhat wild. So on Saturday, March 16th, six IHHA volunteers gave them a much-needed trimming. Working with mini pole-mounted chain saws, loppers, and hand saws the volunteers cut off the branches that overhung the gazebo roof, removed several major branches that were intertwined or "crossed", and thinned the minor branches where needed. Crepe myrtles flower primarily on new growth. The trees may look a bit "raw" for a few more weeks until the new growth kicks in. However, we can anticipate beautiful flower displays in the coming years.

#### Rules of the Road

The speed limit on all Ivy Hill roads is 25 mph. Please set a good example for both your neighbors and outside visitors by always obeying the speed limit. Also, be sure to come to a full stop at all stop signs and look both ways before turning onto the crossing road. There have been several near-accidents reported at Ivy Hill intersections in recent weeks.

Also, watch out for the Ivy Hill deer herd; especially around dusk and dawn. They have become very tame over the past several years and will usually just stand and watch you drive slowly by. However, they are still wild animals and may suddenly panic and dash in front of your vehicle with little warning. So you should always drive slow enough so that you can stop in time if they should bolt. Better yet, stop and let them cross the road before you drive on.

#### Ivy Lake Dam Recertified

The Ivy Lake dam was recertified by the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation's Dam Safety and Floodplain Management & Soil and Water Conservation commission on September 30, 2018. The certification is good for 6 years.

#### **Architectural Committee**

Spring is the ideal time to start any major exterior renovations on your home. It is also the peak time for new home construction starts. The Ivy Hill Architectural Committee reminds all Ivy Hill property owners that the time to seek Architectural Committee approval of both new construction and any "building, fence, outside lighting, screen planting, or other improvements" on your property is <u>before</u> construction begins. It is always much more cost effective to get your plans approved before you start building than to have to make changes when work is already in progress.

Also, be sure to review both the general Ivy Hill Restrictions and any additional restrictions that are applicable for your specific neighborhood when you are drawing up your plans. Copies of the restrictions for most neighborhoods can be found on the Ivy Hill website (ivyhill-forest.org).
