The Restrictions require that all construction and exterior improvements in the Ivy Hill subdivision be approved in advance by the Architectural Committee.

One of the major projects that we undertaking this Fall, is to redo the more than 40 year old roof on the gazebo at the Ivy Hill main entrance. Runk & Pratt will be helping us in this project. They will be suppling the labor and we will purchase the materials. We are very grateful for Runk & Pratt's support.

Remember that the speed limit in Ivy Hill is 25 mph. Social distancing and masks work. Be safe.


Welcome

Ivy Hill History

This is a copy of the back side of the early tri-fold flyer advertising the Ivy Hill community that was featured in the Ivy Hill History column in the September issue of this Newsletter. The flyer was probably printed before 1980. The spectacular arial photo on the left side of the flyer shows the tennis courts, pool, pavilion, and clubhouse as they appeared just after those first two amenities were constructed and the latter two were converted from farm buildings to their current purposes. The arial photograph was probably taken by either Allen Harvey, the original developer of Ivy Hill, or his son-in-law. They were both pilots and kept planes in Ivy Hill for many years. We even had a small airport with a grass landing strip here in the subdivision. The new Ivalace by the Greens townhouse development is being built in part on the former runway.

Note the absence of tall trees along the golf course in the pictures on the right side of the tri-fold flyer. If you return to these same vantage points today, you will find that everything has grown up over the many decades that have elapsed since then.
