Did you know that there is a cemetery between the 6th and 7th holes on the Ivy Hill golf course? It is believed that Reverend Charles Clay, the original owner of Ivy Hill, and some of his family members are buried there. The Liberty University History Department has taken on the challenge to restore the cemetery. The project is in the beginning planning stage. We will keep you informed as the plans evolve. The IHHA is actively involved in Bedford County politics and policy where they impact the Ivy Hill community. If there are issues that you think we should get involved with, please contact us at ivyhillforest@gmail.com and we will take your concerns under consideration.

Ivy Hill is a deeded community. There is a sentence at the bottom of your deed which states: "The property hereby conveyed is conveyed subject to all ... restrictions heretofore imposed upon said property ... now binding thereon." The restrictions are imposed by the Developer of your neighborhood, not the IHHA. So regardless of whether you belong to the IHHA or not, these restrictions apply to your property. Please read and review the Reservations & Restrictions that are applicable to your neighborhood. They can be found on your web site at ivyhill-forest.org under Planning\Homeowner Association\lvy Hill\lvy Hill Restrictions.

The Ivy Hill Architectural Committee has to review and approve any new construction or outside projects like additions, decks, porches, pools, fencing, or mass plantings. Ivy Hill History

This column originally appeared in the October 2012 Newsletter. We are reprinting it in this issue due to the renewed community interest in restoring the cemetery.

Newcomers to Ivy Hill may wonder what lies in the small thicket of trees between the 6th and 7th holes on the golf course. It isn't obvious anymore. Older residents know that those broken-down brick walls surround the original Ivy Hill plantation cemetery. One of the people that is buried in that cemetery is believed to be the Reverend Charles Clay.

Reverend Clay, who was the rector of the Episcopal Church in Bedford, purchased a tract of land in 1756 adjacent to Thomas Jefferson's Poplar Forest. It was probably located in the area between the Forest railroad depot and the southern boundary of the current lvy Hill. Reverend Clay purchased

three adjoining tracts of land totaling approximately 1,300 acres between 1779 and 1784 and added them to the estate, These later purchases are believed to include all the land in the current lvy Hill.

Reverend Clay died in 1820 and was buried on his estate in the cemetery. Reverend Clay apparently did some things during his life that he came to regret as death approached. One of his final requests was to have 100 wagon loads of rocks placed on his grave "so the devil will be unable to get to me." The pile of rocks can be seen to this day if you know where to look. (Watch out for copperheads!)
